Affordable rents are based on the lesser of:

- Most current average wages published by the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development; or
- Most current rents affordable to households at 80% area median income HUD (AMI).

Beginning in 2017, in no case will the Affordable to Local Workforce rent limit be lower than the 60% MTSP rent limits for the Low Income Housing Tax Credit Program. Rents are held at previous year levels in areas with wage/income decreases.
